Welcome to the 2021 golfing year at Lakeside Lodge Golf Club. I would like to take this opportunity to introduce myself, welcome you to the club and encourage you all to get involved in our wonderful Ladies' section.

Please take some time to read this booklet as it provides information on all aspects of Ladies' golf here at Lakeside Lodge and is especially useful for those Ladies who are new to the club.

Whether you are a competitive golfer, like to play for your own pleasure, a high or low handicapper, experienced player or novice, there are opportunities for you to get involved throughout the year. We run both 9 and 18-hole Medal and Stableford competitions on a monthly basis (see pages 11 to 13), Club competitions, Inter-club and County competitions.

We run a Ladies' weekly 'Twilight Season' which starts 13th April until 17th August from 4:50pm onwards - do look at the Ladies' notice board and the website for the programmed details and watch out for the emails from the Vice Captain, Jacqui Newcombe. Twilight is a perfect opportunity for all abilities of golfer to get out for 9 holes of golf. The formats are different every week to make it fun and there are a variety of individual, pairs and team events to mix things up. You don't have to have a handicap to attend twilight and I would encourage all Ladies to come along. It is a great opportunity for you to get to know other lady members as well as for the less experienced golfer to learn some of the rules, build on your confidence and play out on the course.

2. GENERAL GOLFING MATTERS

2.1. Rules of Golf

Whenever you play it is essential that you have an understanding of the Rules of Golf.. There are a variety of publications that explain the rules, which can be accessed via the R&A shop section of their website.

Please familiarise yourself with the rules and also, if possible, attend the rules evenings which are run during the Twilight season.

2.2. Local Rules

Local rules relating to course on the Lakeside complex are printed on the back of the scorecard, so please ensure that you familiarise yourself with these too.

2.3. Temporary Rules

These are displayed on notice boards in the Pro Shop. Two of the more common temporary rules relate to:

Ground Under Repair (GUR): free relief within one club length from the nearest point of relief, no nearer the hole

Preferred lies/winter rules – when these are in operation (normally during the winter months) you may mark, lift, clean and replace your ball within six inches of the marker, no nearer the hole, when on the fairway. This does not apply to balls in the rough.

2.4. Pace of play

Slow play is frustrating so you must do your utmost to play at a good pace. The Committee has determined that a 4-ball round on the Lodge Course should take no longer than 4½ hours. It is a group's responsibility to keep up with the group in front. If the group loses a clear hole and is delaying the group behind, it should invite the group behind to play through, irrespective of the number of players in that group. Where a group has not lost a clear hole, but it is apparent that the group behind can play faster, it should invite the faster moving group to play through.

Whilst we do not operate a strict timing protocol, you are expected to adhere to the 4½ maximum for a 4-ball round. In addition, recent guidance from England Golf suggests that you should take no more than 40 seconds per shot – this starts from the point at which you reach your ball. Have a think about this and if you are taking longer, you may need to make some adjustments to your planning and set-up.

2.5. Course etiquette

It is important that you pay due regard to the safety of other players, show them consideration and take good care of the course by raking bunkers and repairing divots and pitch marks.

2.6. Insurance

You are advised to protect yourself against third party insurance claims. You may already be covered, but please do check your home contents policy terms or consider a specialist golf insurance company. If you want more information about insurance, talk to a member of the team in the Pro Shop.

3. LOCAL MATTERS

3.1. Booking Tee Times

Members can book tee times two weeks in advance through the Pro Shop or the Lakeside Lodge Golf Centre website. You must inform the Pro Shop that you have arrived and are intending to play at the appointed time. You must remember to cancel tee times if you are not going to play.

You should allow yourself adequate time to prepare for playing and should always be ready to tee off at least five minutes before your booked tee time.

For the purposes of the monthly medals and Stableford competitions ONLY, members may book for the next monthly competition in advance (normally up to four weeks). The assumption is that those members who take advantage of this privilege are making a statement of intent to enter the competition.

3.2. Competition entry fees

There is normally an entry fee for all club competitions. All such entry fees must be paid by the stated closing date.

Entry fees for monthly 18-hole Stableford and Medal competitions are to be paid on the day and must be paid before commencing your round. The entry fee of £4 for the Stableford competition is mandatory, but the entry fee of £4 for the Medal competition is optional. If you choose not to pay the entry fee you will not be eligible for a prize, but your card will still count for handicap purposes.

The entry fee for the monthly 9 hole competitions is a mandatory £2

3.3. Trolleys

Paths should be used where available and trolleys are not allowed on the tees or greens. Motorised trolleys may not be permitted during the winter period - please see local rules.

3.4. Distance Measuring Devices (DMDs)

The use of DMDs is permitted in all LLGC competitions.

3.5. Ladies' dress code

The standard of dress acceptable for play or within the Clubhouse varies between clubs. The dress code for ladies at Lakeside Lodge is as follows:

only recognised golf shoes may be worn (i.e. no trainers)

only tailored shorts or trousers are allowed and socks must be worn with shorts (no jeans or denims).

ladies are permitted to wear tops with (a) sleeves but no collar or (b) collar but no sleeves.

metal spikes are banned in the Club House and shoes worn in the Club House must be free of mud, and grass etc.

Remember it is always worth checking the dress code in advance when playing other courses as they may have very specific local restrictions.

4. HANDICAP MATTERS

4.1. For a New Player

How to get a Handicap Index.

The player must return 54 holes worth of scores from any combination of 9 or 18 hole rounds.

Each card should be marked 'for handicap index' and should show your name and the date. You and you marker should remember to check and sign the card at the end of the round.

You may place the card in the Ladies' Scorecard box in the foyer of the Clubhouse or in the box in the foyer of the Pro Shop. Alternatively you may send a photo of the card to the Ladies' handicap secretary.

You will be contacted by the handicap secretary regarding your starting handicap index.

Competition results and up-to-date handicap indices are published on the Howdidido website. To register for this facility please visit www.howdidido.com

You may also wish to become a member of England Golf – it's free and you can register by accessing www.englandgolf.org/my-account/. Once registered you will be able to track your handicap and you will be notified by email of any subsequent handicap changes.

4.2 Changes in Handicap

You will be able to find your current handicap index on the PSi unit at the club, on the HowDidiDo website and on your England Golf account. Should you require a handicap certificate you are able to print one from your Handicap page on HowDidiDo.

If you have played in a competition or submitted a casual round score, which may alter your handicap, you will be advised by email around midnight after you have entered your score.

Please do contact the Ladies' Handicap Secretary or a member of the committee if you need any advice about your handicap.

4.3 Casual Round scores

Casual Round scores allow a member the opportunity of submitting scores for handicapping purposes at a time of their choosing. Players must signify their intention to submit a Casual Round score by signing in via the P*S*i, M*S*i or the relevant register prior to playing.

There is no restriction on the number or frequency for the submission of Casual Round scores, which maybe completed over 9 or 18 holes.

4.4 Annual Handicap Review

Your handicap committee conducts annual handicap reviews to ensure they reflect a player's ability. Performance in qualifying competitions, better ball competitions and singles match play events are also taken into consideration.

Handicaps can also be adjusted after a period of extended illness or injury.

5. BEING INVOLVED

One of the important and exciting parts of being a club member is the opportunity to play in a variety of competitions. These range from internal club competitions to interclub and County matches. All of them offer the opportunity to have an enjoyable day playing golf in good company.

The joy of the handicapping system is that it gives all players a chance irrespective of playing ability. Handicapping makes it possible for players of unequal skills to compete on level terms. The more players that join in the more fun we all have, so please do sign up.

You will have received a club fixture list with this booklet. Please go through this and put the dates of the main club competitions and all the ladies' events in your diary. We really would like you all to join in wherever possible.

For those of you who are new to the club or consider yourself to be a novice golfer, the easiest first step is to join in the Ladies' Twilight events and take part in the monthly Medal and Stableford competitions.

5.2 Ladies' Twilight Season

The Ladies' Twilight Season is an ideal opportunity to meet new and existing lady members of the club.

For novice ladies it is a great way to learn more about the game of golf (different formats, etiquette and rules), but most of all it is about having fun, gaining confidence and finding other ladies to play golf with on a more regular basis.

The 2020 season starts on Tuesday 21st April with a par 3 competition and an optional meal. You will need to sign up in advance for the meal, so please check the Ladies' notice board.

The programme runs every Tuesday evening from April until the 18th August and the list of activities is displayed on the Ladies' notice board in the Pro Shop foyer. All you need do is come along between 4:50pm and 5:45pm and we will arrange for you to play 9 holes of golf with at least two other ladies. If you work and are going to come late, please let us know so that we can accommodate you.

It costs £1.50 each week to play in the Twilight games (plus green fees) and the season ends with a meal and prize presentation.

The only thing we ask is that before coming along to Twilight, you should have played at least a few rounds of either 9 or 18 holes.

You do not need to have a handicap to join in.

5.3 Monthly 18-Hole Medal competitions

<i>Month</i>	The third Sunday of the month and the preceding Thursday of each month where the results will be merged to determine the prize winners.
<i>Eligibility</i>	All lady members who have a handicap index
<i>Format</i>	18-hole individual medal play
<i>Tees</i>	Red tees. In winter, if mats are in use, play will be from the permanent red tee markers unless otherwise directed.
<i>Stroke index and par</i>	As per card
<i>Handicap restrictions</i>	None
<i>Prizes</i>	See General Competition Rules paragraph 1.14
<i>Other prizes</i>	Optional 2's fund. If no winner then the prize fund rolls-over to the next Ladies' Stableford.
<i>Meal</i>	No
<i>Qualifying competition for handicap adjustment</i>	Yes
<i>Qualifying competition for King and Queen</i>	Yes - All prize winners
<i>Order of Merit</i>	Under review
<i>Specific conditions</i>	<p>Players must sign in before their round to register their intent to play and after their round to submit their scores by the following methods:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">Via the PSi (Player Score Input) unit located in the foyer of the pro shop.Via the MSi (Mobile Score Input) function within the HowDidiDo app on the player's mobile phone.If you are unable to sign in by using either of the above methods please ask in the pro shop for your name to be entered on the list as you pay your entry fee. <p>The £4 optional <u>prize fund</u> entry fee must also be paid before commencing play. Booking of tee times

For the purposes of the 18-hole monthly medals and stableford competitions ONLY, members may book for the next monthly competition up to 4 weeks in advance.

Reserved tee times for the monthly weekend competitions are within a designated period. Members are encouraged to use these tee times wherever possible and any player without a playing partner can contact the Pro-Shop to ask about vacant slots within any other group. Members can, of course, play at other times on the designated days, but are encouraged to play with others in the same gender competition.

If, however, none of the above is possible, it is permissible to play at any time and have your card marked by any club member . It is anticipated that this may happen on the odd occasion, but should not become the norm.

5.4 Monthly 18-Hole Stableford competitions

<i>Format</i>	18-hole individual stableford
<i>Tees</i>	Red tees. In winter, if mats are in use, play will be from the permanent red tee markers unless otherwise directed.
<i>Stroke index and par</i>	As per card
<i>Handicap restrictions</i>	None
<i>Prizes</i>	See General Competition Rules paragraph 1.14
<i>Other prizes</i>	Optional 2's fund. If no winner then the prize fund rolls-over to the next Ladies' Medal.
<i>Meal</i>	No
<i>Qualifying competition for handicap adjustment</i>	Yes
<i>Qualifying competition for King and Queen</i>	Yes – all prize winners
<i>Order of Merit</i>	Under review

<i>Format</i>	9-hole individual stableford
<i>Tees</i>	Men play off Yellow tees, Ladies play off Red tees In winter, if mats are in use, play will be from the permanent tee markers unless otherwise directed.
<i>Stroke index and par</i>	As per card
<i>Handicap allowance</i>	A handicap adjustment chart is displayed in the Pro-Shop Foyer and must be used to calculate the number of shots the player will receive over the relevant 9 holes.
<i>Handicap restrictions</i>	None
<i>Prizes</i>	See General Competition Rules page 11, paragraph 1.15
<i>Meal</i>	No
<i>Qualifying competition for handicap adjustment</i>	Yes
<i>Qualifying competition for King and Queen</i>	No
<i>Order of Merit</i>	Under review

Additional points

Members may book for the next 9-hole competition up to 4 weeks in advance.

Members are encouraged to play with others in the same gender competition. However, it is permissible to have your card marked by any club member. It is anticipated that this may happen on the odd occasion, but should not become the norm.

5.6 Ladies' internal Club competitions and interclub friendly matches

The Ladies' section has a busy fixture list which includes a number of events that are linked to qualification for county or national competitions. We also play a range of friendly matches against other clubs in the County. Details of these fixtures are in your Fixtures booklet and on the website. We really hope you will join in competitions and matches. Whilst the Ladies Captain selects the teams for interclub matches, all ladies who wish to play in a match will be invited to do so.

5.7 Ladies' interclub County competitions

The Lakeside ladies compete in a number of County interclub competitions. Whilst team selection for these matches is generally based upon handicap and current performance and is mainly at the discretion of the Lady Captain, the intention is still to maximise participation. Details of County competitions can be found in the County 'Blue' book, copies of which are in the foyer to the Pro Shop.

5.8 Other internal club competitions

There are number of Club competitions open to all members - these will be listed in your fixture book and on the website, so please make a note in your diary.

The details of each event (format, entry criteria and specific rules) are detailed in the Club Competitions Book which is available in the Pro Shop foyer and on the members website www.lakesidelodgegolfclub-members.co.uk.

In order to be eligible to play in the majority of Club Competitions you **must have a Competition Handicap**. If you are unsure of your eligibility you should contact the Ladies' Handicap Secretary or check your profile on the 'Howdidido' website (if you are signed up to it - see 4.5).

Where a club competition includes a meal, we would encourage you to attend but it is not mandatory.

Competition details, including eligibility criteria, are displayed well in advance on the notice board outside the Pro Shop. If you wish to play in a competition you should sign up on the list posted on the notice board and pay the entry fee and cost of meal (if applicable) by the closing date.

If the competition is in a pairs format (either ladies or mixed) and you are unable to find a partner, but would still like to play, this is not a problem. You should sign up and we will pair you up with another member who is in a similar situation.
